

## Responsible Minerals Statement

Greenway Electronic Products limited believes in supporting the responsible sourcing of minerals globally.

We recognise the risks associated with the sourcing of certain minerals throughout the global supply chain and we strive to ensure that we do not contribute to conflict, nor by any means profit from, or contribute to, any forms of torture, inhumane treatment, forced labour, child labour, human rights violations, or other serious violations of international human rights and humanitarian law, crimes against humanity or genocide related to the sourcing of these minerals.

As a component distributor, our ability to influence the manufacturing of materials, parts, ingredients, or components of electronic equipment in our supply chain remains limited, but we expect our suppliers to take steps to ensure conflict minerals are not used in any of the equipment related to our supply chain.

This Responsible Minerals Statement addresses the responsible sourcing of minerals in many of the products we sell, where we significantly influence the design or their manufacture. It focuses on the following “Relevant Minerals”: tin, tungsten, tantalum and gold (together known as “conflict minerals” or 3TG metals), and cobalt.

We aim to make sure that our use of Relevant Minerals does not directly or indirectly finance conflict or benefit armed groups, contribute to gross human rights violations and abuses and other risks identified in the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains from Conflict Affected and High-Risk Areas (OECD Due Diligence Guidance), including those located in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or an adjoining country (the “Covered Countries” defined by the US Securities and Exchange Commission’s Conflict Minerals Rule).

However, we recognise that eliminating the acquisition of Relevant Minerals from conflict-affected and high-risk areas may cause economic harm and risk further endangering vulnerable people. Therefore, we do not explicitly ban or stop our suppliers from sourcing from conflict-affected and high-risk areas including the Covered Countries. Instead, we support the use of verified, responsibly mined Relevant Minerals which we consider to responsibly sourced (“Responsible Minerals”).
